MATERNAL, INFANT, AND CHILD HEALTH

- 73 eligible women identified by Ohio Equity Institute (OEI) Neighborhood Navigators
- 185 women screened for eligibility by OEI Neighborhood Navigators
- 1,053 referrals or connections made by OEI Neighborhood Navigators
- Strategies implemented include:
 - Mom’s Advisory Group with Cradle Cincinnati’s Infant Vitality Pilot (IVP) Project in North College Hill
 - In Her Voice Project with North College Hill Schools and Cradle Cincinnati through the IVP Project
 - IVP Project community engagement events in North College Hill in partnership with Cradle Cincinnati
 - Sip n’ Paint
 - Back to School event at North College Hill City Schools
 - Community Garden Planning and Kick-Off event
 - OEI recruitment and engagement events
 - Mamas Roundtables in Bond Hill, Forest Park, Reading, West End, and Westwood
 - Health fairs – Santa Maria, Mercy Health, Women’s Health Resource Fair
 - Hamilton County-Cincinnati Public Library Social Service Fridays
 - Canvassing in 22 priority ZIP codes across Hamilton County
 - Empathy and Cultural Humility training for health care providers at the Infant Mortality Summit in partnership with the Cincinnati-Hamilton County Community Action Team
 - Initiated two quality improvement projects to examine the Pediatric Case Management and Immunization programs at HCPH.
 - Cincinnati-Hamilton County Community Action Team (CAT) began a restructure to include two sub-committees that will be responsible for reviewing and implementing new programs/recommendations provided by the Child Fatality Review and Fetal and Infant Mortality Review Teams.



MENTAL HEALTH AND ADDICTION

- 13,141 people trained to administer Narcan®
- 30,266 doses of Narcan® distributed
- 1,874 Deterra bags distributed
- 12,486 Exchange Project clients
- 1,704 new Exchange Projects clients
- 325,162 syringes exchanged
- Strategies implemented include:
 - Narcan® distribution at the Hamilton County Justice Center
 - Updated Workforce Development Plan to require mental health training for all HCPH staff
 - Safe medication disposal education
 - Provider education regarding the use of Ohio Automated Rx Reporting System (OARRS)
 - CDC Foundation funding to work on Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and Opioids
 - Received an additional allocation of Narcan® from ADAPT Pharma through October 2019 for distribution
- Community engagement events:

 - Juneteenth 2019 Celebration
 - TestFest
 - Santa Maria Health Fair
 - The Health Gap Health Expo



ORAL HEALTH

- Oral Health Coalition launched by the Hamilton County Commissioners in August 2018
- Select data points of the 2015 Oral Health Needs Assessment was updated by Health Management Associates to inform the strategic plan
- The Oral Health Strategic Plan was presented to the Hamilton County Board of County Commissioners in April 2019; the Strategic Plan was adopted in June 2019.
