The mission of IV-CHARIS is to reduce the transmission of HIV/AIDS in underserved communities by creating a non-traditional holistic healing environment that is committed to providing safe and confidential testing, education, prevention, and intervention serviced by caring and well-trained people. IV-CHARIS is the only faith-based organization in Cincinnati that is state qualified to do HIV/STD testing, counseling, and education. The IV-CHARIS abstinence program provides HIV/AIDS education to court adjudicated youth and those in public and private schools.
