H1N1 VACCINE CLINICS CENTRALLY LOCATED IN THE COUNTY

HAMILTON COUNTY, OHIO – H1N1 flu is still circulating in the community and vaccination is the best protection against H1N1 flu. Hamilton County Public Health has announced additional H1N1 vaccination clinics. The following locations will administer free H1N1 vaccine to anyone in the general public regardless of residency:

H1N1 vaccine is available in two forms – injectable and nasal spray. The injectable is a killed virus and is appropriate for most people to receive. The nasal spray (FluMist) is a live, but weakened virus vaccine and only available for healthy people 2 – 49 who are not pregnant. Both types of vaccine are used yearly to prevent seasonal flu and are very safe. Medical dispensing staff screens individuals in order to provide the appropriate form of vaccine.
